THE RHYMING SUMMARIST

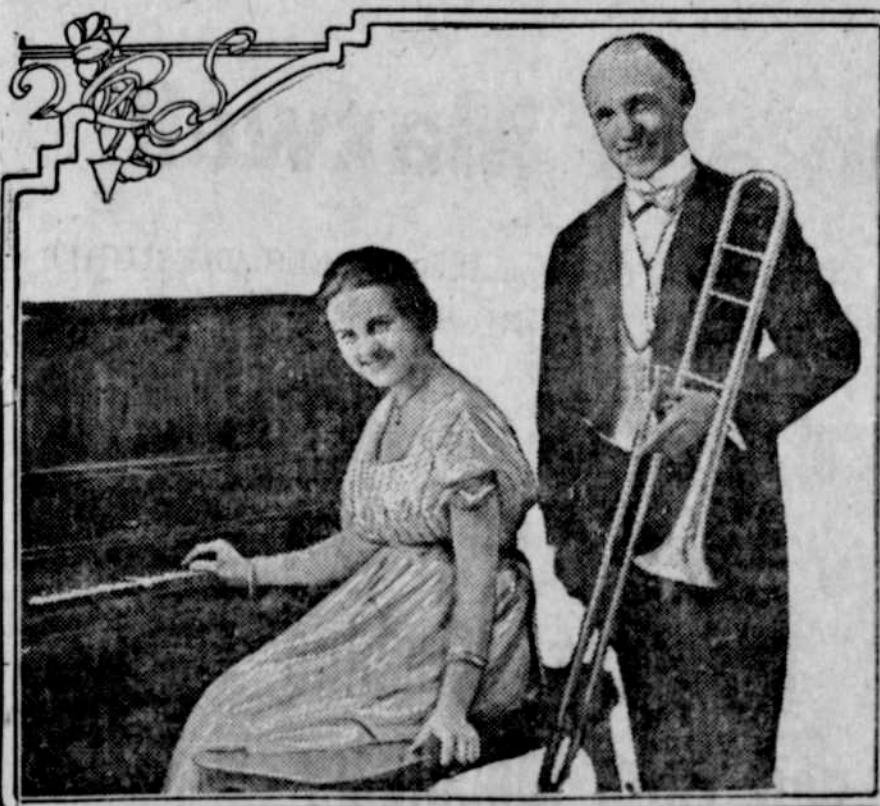
Chautauqua days are in our midst

New Problem For Italy
