Minneapolis Symphony Orchestra at Normal.

The special entertainment season of the Oregon Normal School will be opened here auspiciously by the famous Minneapolis Symphony orchestra, Emil Oberholfer, conductor, which will appear at the Oregon Normal School Chapel Sunday afternoon, Oct. 3, with a group of soloists, including the eminent prima donna of the Chicago Grand Opera company, Miss Florence Macbeth, who sang with the Portland Apollo Club last year; James Williams, famous Welsh harpist, and J. Roetgen, master cellist.

Laurence A. Lambert of the Western Musical bureau has the exclusive management of the orchestra for the Western United States and Western Canada for a series of some 18 concerts.
