BLACKBIRD AND ROBIN MATE

Students of Bird Life Will Find it Hard to Credit Most Remarkable Alliance.

Capt. J. C. Sistare, fair and square sailorman, and E. M. Ashby, good citizen and true, have been shocked at the alliance which has been formed between a rather rakish-looking blackbird and a robin, which have evidently formed a partnership and have started house-keeping together, says a Noank (Conn.) dispatch.

HONORS FRIEND AND FOE.

Marking the line of battle at Salem church and close beside the famed plank road that leads from Fredericksburg to Chancellorsville is a monument erected to the Twenty-third Jersey infantry by the state of New Jersey. It is a graceful shaft surmounted by the statue of a soldier chiseled in gray marble, like many other battlefield memorials, but it is one of the few, if not the only shaft on a battlefield, which pays homage alike to friend and enemy. On one side New Jersey lovingly honors the members of the Twenty-third regiment, who advanced into terrific rifle fire in the woods on Salem heights, and on the other is graven the tribute of the state to the Alabama men who held the line during the two fearful hours of a May day in 1863, when death in the falling dusk took heavy toll. —Birmingham Age-Herald.
