DENTISTRY IN OLD SIDON

Proof That Ancients Had Very Much More Than a Crude Knowledge of Their Work.

Almost exactly the same things the modern dentist does were done no less than 25 centuries ago. Excavations at a Phoenician necropolis at Sidon shows that the early nobles were concerned about their teeth as much as their present-day brothers. Almost perfect specimens of "bridge" work, done by means of fine gold wires, have been unearthed. The teeth are well preserved, despite the fact that bones found in the same tombs have crumbled away. Although the idea is carried out crudely, the "bridge" was effected in the mouth of a noble which proved unusually effective, according to investigations. The difference, say the investigators, between ancient and the present-day methods of forming "bridges" is that now artificial teeth are substituted, while in the Fourth and Fifth centuries before Christ molars many times were taken forcibly from persons in humble station in life to replenish the decayed teeth of nobles.

Disappearing after killing another man in a fit of jealousy two years ago, a young man in Ambergon, near Toulouse, France, was discovered dead in a garret by his father. The body had been hanging from a nail in the garret of a farm house that had been untenanted from about the time of the crime.

FOOTHILLS OF RARE BEAUTY

Observer Asserts That Those Along the California Coast Are Unsurpassed in the World.

In beauty of form and color the foothills lying along the California coast from San Francisco to San Diego are quite the equal of any in the world. They are made up of loose granite, are sparsely covered with short growths, and have been rounded by winds and rain until they are as smooth as the Scotch hills. In the afternoon light they take up hues of heliotrope as a body color and upon this are often blended olive shades of live-oak and sycamore—the whole flattened in a decorative pattern like tapestry. At Santa Barbara these hills come down to the blue waters of the Pacific with a strange mingling of warm and cool colors that is nevertheless harmonious and supremely beautiful. Farther south and back from the coast the bare, desert foot-

hills of the San Bernardino range have only warmth of hue, but this warmth is wonderfully delicate in rose-reds, opals, lilacs, terra-cottas, and air blues. There is no mountain color like that seen in and about the desert ranges.—John C. Van Dyke.

Because of the constructional conditions attending submarine design, according to Admiral Sir H. Bacon, a craft which navigates below water loses a large per cent of its surface fighting efficiency. Ton for ton, the fighting and scouting efficiency of a submersible craft of whatever size is only about 15 per cent of that of the surface vessel. Sir George Owens Thurston, naval director of Vickers, Ltd., gives figures to show that a submarine of 5,400 tons, having a surface speed of 30 knots, could mount an armament of only one 5.5-inch and one three-inch gun.
