



ELECTRIC MOTOR CAR WATCH Engine of Minute Size, Invention of

Frenchman, is Said to Give Perfect Satisfaction.

An electric motor, reduced to such a minute size that it can be used to operate the works of a watch of normal shape, is a recent French invention, described in Popular Mechanics Magazine. Besides the motor, the watch contains a battery, equally minute, to furnish the necessary current. This is a liquid battery in a water-tight case, with partitions, all of an indestructible material. The motor is only about three-eighths inch in diameter and is composed of two concentric fields, with an armature mounted between them, all serrated. Its commutator is in the form of a small cavity which retains in it, by capillary attraction, one drop of

Big Alligator Negroes' Prize.


