FROM POLK COUNTY OBSERVER

O. L. Hawley of Mountmouth, E. V. C. Part of Buell, Thos. Brunk of Eola, W. W. Ayers and H. H. Belt of Dallas, were appointed at a regular meeting of the Commercial Club of Dallas Wednesday, Nov. 20, to submit plans for a temporary county fair organization. The committee reported recommending a president and five vice presidents, secretary and treasurer, executive committee of three members, a board of district managers, and a board of directors. W. A. Ayres of Dallas was elected temporary president; city park was suggested for a permanent site.

Wm. Wright (known as Billy Horseraddish) has started action against sheriff Grant and J. of P. Holman of Dallas for \$20,000 damages for alleged detention in the county jail. The suit results from a complaint filed against J. R. Haselton who had leased a property from Wright. Wright had a bill of sale to the property and was arrested and placed in jail for carrying a concealed weapon and an assault with a deadly weapon.

Many of these meetings will be held on Friday afternoons, thus getting all of the parents and members of the board of the

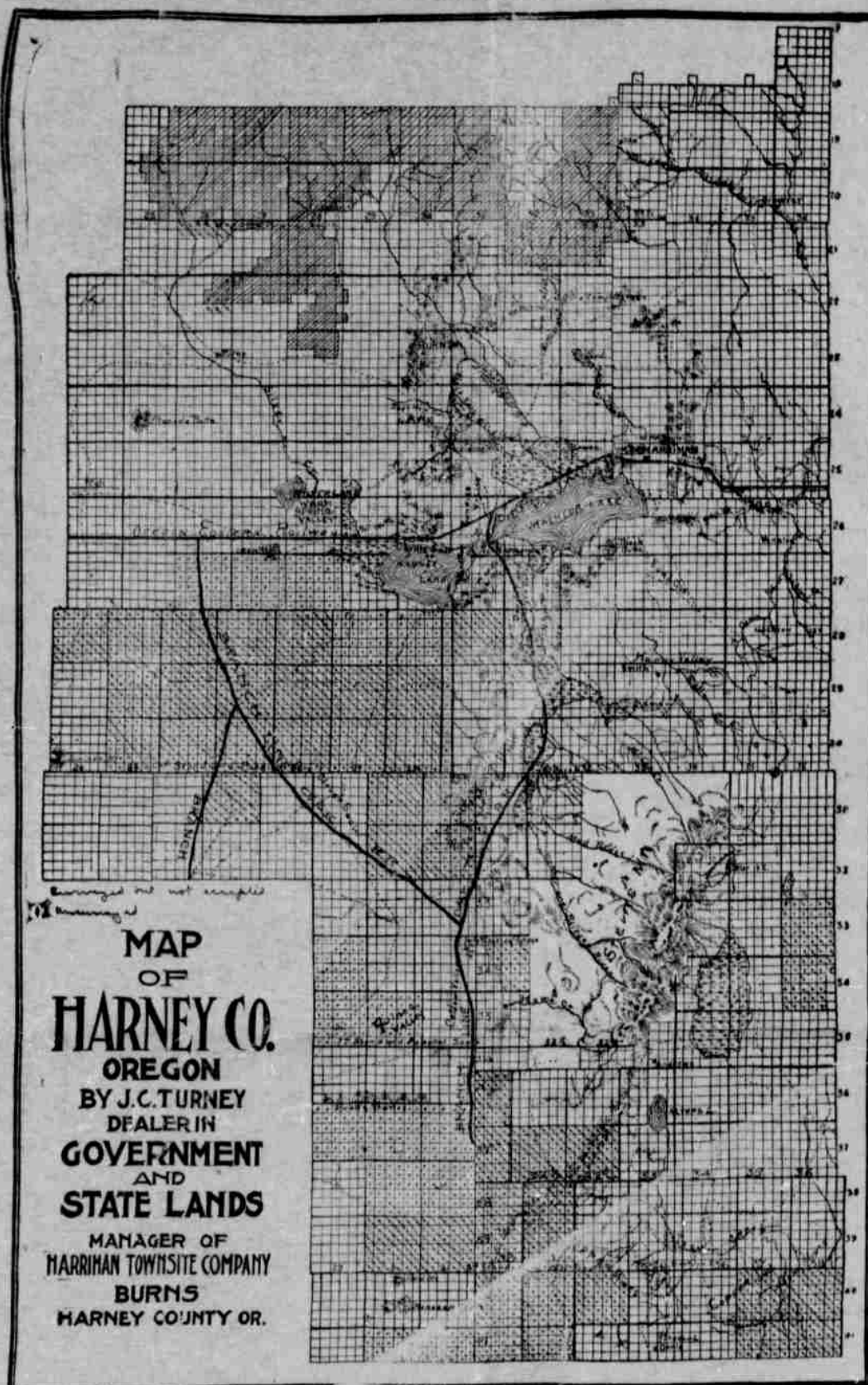
meeting. All dates are subject to change if the people of the district desire some other date.

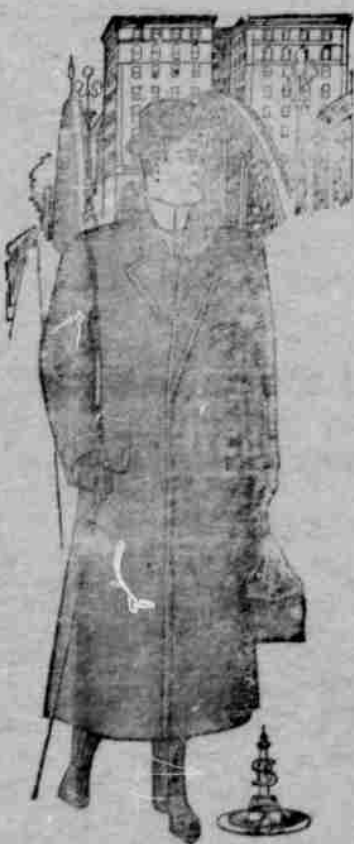


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
