

EOLA SECTION IS PROSPEROUS

Hop Raising, Poultry and Fruit Raising

Poultry Raising One of the Big Industries Being now Developed

Eola is located 4 miles from Salem, 10 miles from Dallas, 8 miles from Independence on the S. F. C. W. R. R. and in a cozy nook overlooking the beautiful Willamette river and with a little capital invested could be made one of the most beautiful spots in Oregon. Its principal industry is hop raising. There is very little grain farming done in the immediate vicinity of Eola as the greater portion of the land adjacent to the town is quite hilly and as it is cleared it is being set to fruit and as the hills protect us from the cold north winds in the spring and winter makes an ideal place for the culture of fruit. Mr. B. I. Ferguson who owns one of the finest cherry orchards in the state of Oregon has in the last 9 years had his crop damaged by cold weather but once and that was March 1909 when we had an extra cold spring. Considerable property has changed hands here in the last year and improvements of various kinds taken place. Mr. Thos. Holman who has big property holdings here has modernized his own home here and also improved some of his tenement houses. W. D. Magee purchased property here about a year ago and has increased the value of his place considerable by the improvements he made. H. D. Landon purchased about 25 acres of bottom land partly cleared which he intends to set to berries possibly logan.

B. I. Ferguson who owns a tract of 10 acres devotes his time to fruit and poultry. He has an apiary of about 30 stands of bees from which he derives quite an income and which he thinks is also responsible for the splendid fruit crops he has every year as the bees do the work of properly pollinating the blossoms. The large hop yard of Williams and Yokum is situated here which afford employment for quite a number of men the year around as does also the large yard on

the Gilbert Patterson place. Mr. Carlson who has leased the hop yards for a term of years raised on an average of 1 ton per acre last year.

The McNary estate has sold several tracts of land of 10 and 20 acres each and new homes will be springing up there in a short time. W. H. Dancy of Salem who purchased a tract of 20 acres contemplates setting it to prunes this spring.

The E. Clements Horst Co. are having 2 bridges erected on their right of way they leased of the Eola Live stock Co., and expect to build large ware houses here in the near future on the S. F. C. W. R. R. Poultry is not neglected here. The S. L. Robbins plant here is one of the largest in the north west. Mr. Robbins raises R. I. Reds, T. L. Acuff, white leghorns, Mr. Mitty has a splendid flock of paying white leghorns and Mr. Vanderburg has the favored and last but not least every house in Eola but three are watered from living springs back in the hills which is the main assurance of good health.
