Now to Make Connection with S. P. Trains at Monmouth

The new time table of the Southern Pacific, by reason of the extension of the service from Dallas to Airle, the Yambull division takes effect Sunday.

As a result the new service on the Independence and Monmouth motor will be as follows:

P. train, and connecting with S. P. train from Airle, 1:10 p. m. connecting with S. P. train from Airle, 2:20 p. m. connecting with S. P. train for Airle, 4:00 p. m. for Monmouth and at 7:20 connecting with motor car at Dallas at 7:55.

Trains leave Monmouth at 6:45 connecting with Portland train, 8:20 for Independence, 11:35 for Independence, 1:40 for Independence, 2:35 for Independence, 4:15 for Independence connecting with motor car for Salem, and 8:00 p. m. for Independence.
