## YOUNG FOLKS' CORNER

### Geography Game.

This is a game for the young. A lead is chosen and all the other players are given pencil and paper. Then the game begins. The object is to see who can think of the most geographical names beginning with a given letter in a certain time. The leader announces the letter to be used. For instance, he says "A," whereupon all the players begin to write as fast as possible geographical names beginning with "A." At the end of two minutes, or whatever time has been decided upon as the time limit, the leader calls "Time," and the players must all stop writing. Then the leader passes on to another initial, which he announces in the same manner, calling the time limit in this letter as he did for the first one.

It is not a good plan to name letters in alphabetical order, as this gives the players some advantage. Indeed, the leader should jump from place to place in the alphabet and thus confuse the players and throw them off the track. Usually it is enough to take ten or fifteen letters before ending the game. It should be announced at the beginning that there must be no going back on the list, but when time is called on a letter it is finished with, and the player must not add any more names to the list which he has written under it. At the close of the game a prize may be given to the player who has written the most names.

### Forming Habits.

What boy or girl has not "habits" of various kinds? There is a very good definition of the word. It is, "Habit is a chain that grows stronger every day." Bad habits seem to grow stronger more rapidly than good ones. Therefore if you want to have good habits when you are old from them while you are young and let them be growing strong all the while you live, have you ever heard your friends say, "I have grown so in the habit of sleeping late that I have to rush to school every day to prevent myself coming late?" It is just as easy to grow into the habit of waking up at half past six as at half past seven. A little will do the work. When you retire at night say to yourself, "Tomorrow I want to get up at 6:30." In all probability you will be your own alarm clock and will wake up on the minute. With a little practice you will get in the habit of being early and punctual.

### Umbrellas.

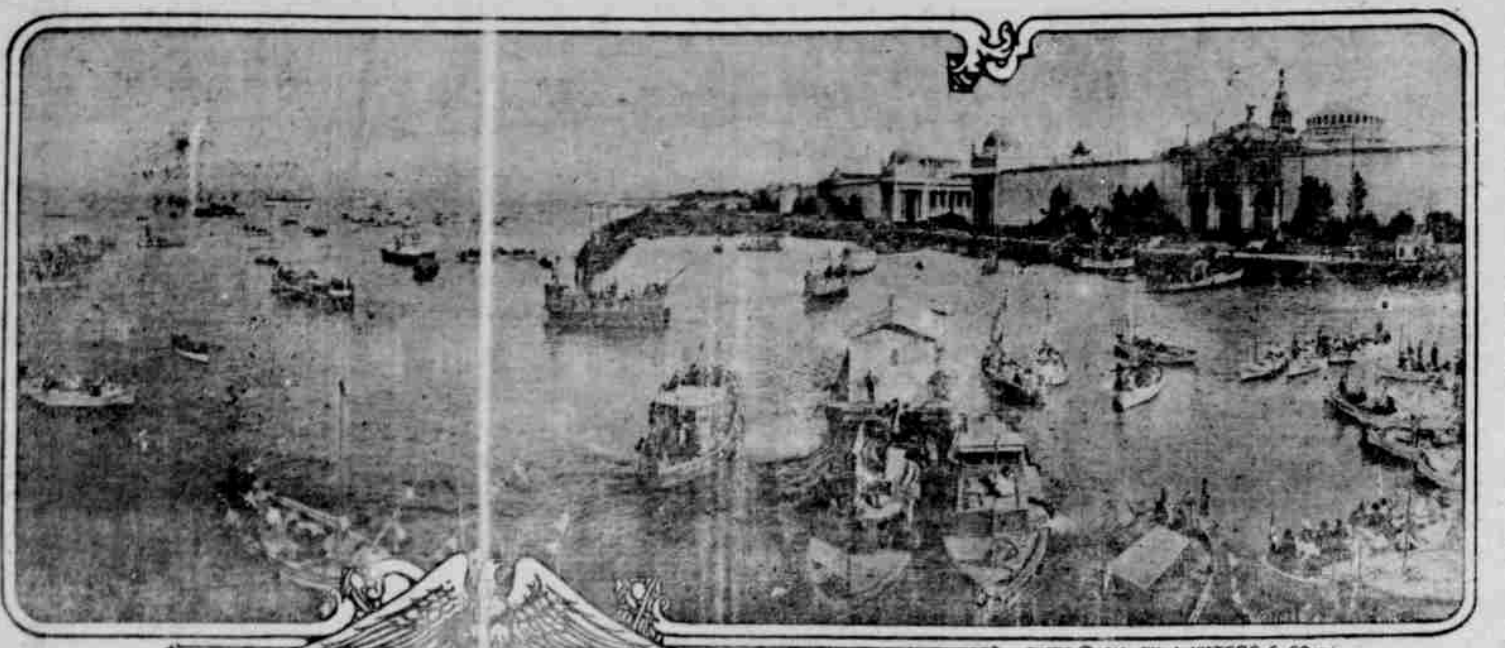

# Six Thousand Mile Motorboat Race to End at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition

THE New York to San Francisco Cruising Power Boat Race for a prize of \$10,000, offered by the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, starts at San Gate, New York, from the Atlantic Yacht club on Oct. 1, 1915, and finishes at the Exposition Yacht Harbor on the Exposition grounds in San Francisco. It is the most important event in the history of

motorboat racing. The course is laid from New York to Charleston, S. C.; to Key West, around the western end of Cuba and on through the Caribbean sea to Colon, passing through the Panama canal to Panama northward to Corinto, Nicaragua; to Salina Cruz, Mexico; to San Pedro, Cal., and ends in San Francisco bay. The finish of the great race is timed to occur dur-

ing the splendid International Yacht Regatta to be held there, and several hundred thousand spectators will crowd the finish as the contestants dash in through the Golden Gate past the wonderful City of Palaces that has grown there to receive the honors due the winners and the losers of the most spectacular race of its kind ever run.

## ROUNDING UP A MEAN RASCAL

Girl Saves Her Lover From Plot of a Villain.

The prisoner was a young man barely twenty-two. His appearance was that of one who had been reared under refining influences, and he seemed broken down under a situation that might not have troubled the sensitiveness of a common criminal. The case was opened by the prosecuting attorney, who said:

"We propose to show, your honor, that the prisoner is the only person who could have taken the money, that he spent a part of it, and the rest was found on his person. Call Thomas Judd."
