When the name of Count Albert Apponyi, the veteran Hungarian leader, was first put forward to fill the vacant post of Austro-Hungarian ambassador to the United States the acclamations of his visits to this country were recalled.

Count Apponyi is one of the most distinguished of the European statesmen of today. An eloquent orator, with a singularly striking command of English, he has won the respect of the many Americans who have heard him speak during his visits to the United States. He comes of a family that traces its descent from King Bela IV

He was formerly minister of public instruction, privy councillor, member of the permanent court of arbitration at The Hague and member of the international parliamentary union.
