A non-partisan tariff commission is a good thing and we are glad that President Wilson favors it, even if he had to change his mind to do so. During a hundred years of tariff making, political parties have used it as a pawn to advance their own interests and to draw campaign contributions from corporations. It is time that the tariff was framed solely for the benefit of the country.

Lamar Tooze, who was a guest of Henry Ford on the recent peace mission, has returned home and is frightened for the safety of his country "I feel uneasy when I think of our small army, he says, "Holland has an army of 400,000 men and I sincerely believe that Holland could lick us."
