He is ex-officio member of the board of regents of the State University, Agricultural College and Normal School, custodian of the seal of the state, compiles the election laws, road laws, the blue book and session laws. He even manages the fiscal affairs of the state. Keeps a record of all appropriations, funds, revenues, expenditures, disburse ments and investments. He directs and superintends the anal check on the State Treasurer.
