

ARE LAYING IN SUPPLIES

Various Stories Going 'Round Regarding the Blue Ledge Mining Company.

A great number have become imbued with the idea that the Blue Ledge Mining company will close down the mine as soon as they are able to get a patent for their ground. A surveyor from the Ridsen Iron Works is now in that district and it is stated that he is running new lines and straightening up the old survey and otherwise getting the property in shape to patent. The idea seems to prevail that this company will endeavor to secure other valuable prospects near to their property, and by closing down for a time they can purchase them at a more reasonable figure than at this time. These are merely conjectures, and no one, outside of the owners, themselves, knows what the outcome will be.

To offset the argument, it is known that the Blue Ledge people are employing more men all the time and that they are buying new material and provisions, so that it looks as though they intended to work the property this winter. Seventy-five tons of baled hay are now being delivered at the mine, the price paid being about \$1500. There has been unloaded from the cars here several ore cars and some machinery which is being transported to the mine as rapidly as teams can be secured, and provisions in great quantities are being constantly hauled to that district. Property owners and miners who have been in town this week from that district state that a great deal of building and preparations for the winter are going on, while the mine is being actively developed. About 149 men are now employed by this company alone, and more would be put to work if they could be secured. All the miners seem to be well pleased with the company and state that they are a good concern to work for.

Rush for Land.

About 8000 acres of unappropriated Government land has been thrown open for entry at the U. S. land office at Roseburg. The land consists of odd sections and parts of sections in the Siskiyou reserve in Jackson, Josephine, and Curry counties and also in Douglas and Lane counties. Jackson county has one whole section, No. 26, of 40-6, and in the same township and range parts of the following sections: 12, 20, 24 and 34, also parts of section 4, 6, 8, and 18 of 39-6. Last Monday 16 applicants, who had been standing in line for nearly a week, were admitted to the land office to file on this land. The first man to be admitted was S. M. Carpenter of Jacksonville. Most of the land lies in Jackson county and but small parcels in Douglas and Lane counties, and while there are many seekers after claims, the cruisers who know the land say there are only one or two good timber claims in the whole lot. But whether there is a million feet or only enough to build a cabin the land is taken up for timber, such is the demand.
