In matter of road petitioned for by A. J. Florey et al. Ordered that this matter be continued until next term.

In matter of filing fee in case of Belle Daley vs. estate of D. P. Matthews, deceased. Ordered that county treasurer be authorized to pay to W. R. Coleman \$5 erroneously paid to him in said matter.

In matter of the adjustment of taxes on the Levi J. Pierce lands. Ordered that these lands which were incorrectly described be released from any claim for taxes on account of said description.

In matter of tax certificate No. 970 for delinquent taxes for 1904. Ordered that amount received on account of said assessment and sale of property be accepted in full payment of amount due on taxes.

In matter of sale of land in Tp. 34 S., R. 1 E. Ordered that county clerk deliver to J. R. Neil deed to said property on payment of \$250. Said money to be turned into the county general fund.
