

## COURT HOUSE

A handsome railing and desk has been placed in the sheriff's office and the office has been enlarged, all of which was a much needed improvement.

Ephriam Wilson has received the appointment as janitor of the court house, his bid of \$40 per month being the lowest. He will enter upon his new duties next week.

Jack Montgomery was indicted for selling intoxicating liquors without having a license, and will be tried at the December term of court. He is now out on bonds.

Sheriff Jackson took Harry McRae of Medford to the State reform school last Thursday. Young McRae, it is alleged, tried to stab his mother with a pitchfork, and was otherwise incorrigible.

On last Sunday, the season for killing elk opened. Each hunter is allowed to kill one elk. The season closes October 15. This is the first year since 1902 that it has been lawful to kill elk in the state of Oregon.

Among the witnesses in the circuit court this week were, F. R. McIntosh, Portland, Chas. Turpin, chief of police, Medford, W. H. Barr, F. M. Stewart and R. W. Gray, Medford, Hamilton Watkins, mail carrier, Eagle Point and D. T. Irwin, Ashland.

Taxes will be delinquent on the first Monday in October. Under the new law passed last February there will be no more sheriff's sales in Oregon and the delinquent tax list will not be printed in a county newspaper. Anyone can pay the tax on any piece of property which is redeemable any time within three years, but the owner of the property must pay 15 per cent. interest to the payer of the tax when the property is redeemed. When there is more than one who wishes to pay the tax on a certain piece of property, the person bidding the lowest rate of interest is allowed to pay said tax. After three years have elapsed and the owner of the property does not redeem it, the usual legal process is gone through with and the payer of the tax becomes the owner. When no individual pays the tax on any property upon which the tax is delinquent, the county will pay said tax and demand the 15 per cent. interest and the same process will take place as if an individual had paid the tax.
