

## ROGUE RIVER VALLEY MINES

**The Next Big Mining Boom will  
Take Place in this Section,  
Says Mining Men.**

The following from the Rogue River Courier is very interesting and is in accordance with the ideas of The Post. We have contended all along that the mines of this section will prove to be mighty big factors in building up the country:

"Slowly but very surely the fact is beginning to dawn upon the mining world of this country that right here in the Rogue River Valley is one of the most promising fields for future development to be found anywhere. Evidences of this assertion are coming to light very frequently these days and it is no uncommon thing to find that the wealthy mining syndicates from outside districts have their representatives here making observations and getting hold of valuable claims. Invariably they return very favorably impressed with the many promising properties which they discover in this region.

"During the past week Grants Pass had as its guest a man who has been quite closely identified with the mining movement in Alaska and who has just come from a prolonged sojourn in the famous mining camps which surround Goldfield, Nevada. This party J. L. Williamson of Seattle Wash., did not hesitate to express it as his private opinion that the mining industry hereabouts was on the verge of a real boom and he bases his expectations upon what he has heard from the lips of the mining men in those other regions.

"Mr. Williamson remarked to the Courier representative that he had only recently heard successful and far seeing mining men at Goldfield discussing this mining section and that it seemed to be their undivided opinion that the next mining excitement was going to occur right here in southern Oregon. He says they have come to this conclusion from actual observation and by making calculations which are based upon real facts. They feel confident that this district is lying within the belt which they find stretches all along through the richest of the camps. They have been studying the formations and the general lay of the land and they are willing to risk their reputation as successful mining men on making such assertions.

"This will be a great thing for the men who are delving into the bowels of the earth for the precious metals, for it will afford them a climate that has no superior and very few equals. Mr. Williamson took occasion to emphasize this fact and stated that no ordinary man could long survive the very trying climate which they have in Goldfield. The morality there is something awful to contemplate and were it not for the wonderfully rich ore that is to be had in such great abundance people would never remain to inhabit that section. As it is he says it is beyond all doubt the richest camp in the world.

"The opinion of Mr. Williamson is being coincided in by numerous mining experts who come this way making careful observations of the properties which are here to be found. Of course all this sounds good for the minerals of the Rogue River Valley are undoubtedly one of its greatest and best assets."

### Law's Legal Decisions.

Synopses of Land and Mineral Decisions, furnished the Post by Woodford D. Harlan, Land Attorney, Washington, D. C.

**COAL LANDS**—Priority of possession and improvements of coal land, followed by filing and development of the mine, entitle the claimant to the preference right of purchase.

**CONTEST, PRACTICE**—The contestant may dismiss the contest at the local office while it is pending on appeal (by the contestee).

**MEANDERED STREAM**—Entry covering tracts of land upon the opposite side of a meandered stream, allowed in accordance with existing practice, will not be disturbed.

**FINAL PROOF**—When proof is prematurely submitted new proof will be required.

**HOMESTEAD ENTRY**—A homestead seller who makes entry of a part of the land embraced in his settlement claim, thereby abandons said claim as to the remainder.

**MINERAL LAND**—The return of the surveyor-generals to the character of the land constitutes but a small element of consideration when the question as to the true character of the land is at issue.

### New Land Office Order.

The Commissioner of the General Land Office has issued an order which requires the registers and receivers of all United States land offices to prepare all applications to make entries and filings on public lands when they are requested to do so by the applicants. This order will insure greater security papers of this kind, and be a saving to the applicants who have heretofore been required to have their applications prepared at their own expense.

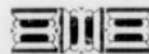

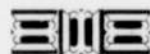
