

COUNTY JAIL IS CRITICISED

Bureau of Charities Cite Jackson County Bastile as Horrible Example.

The following report has been received by the Post from the National Bureau of Charities and the Commons. This bureau has taken up the matter of county jails over the land and for some reason or other, the jail at Jacksonville was taken as the "horrible example." They found the jail here to be in a good condition, however, as compared to a great number throughout the country.

Here is the report:
"It is a pretty bad case that the American Prison association has found against the average county jail in this country. For a year past hundreds of trained men and women have been working on investigations and compiling results, and now the association is prepared to announce just what conditions were found. To state that, generally speaking, county jails are 'schools for crime' is putting it mildly. The general report of the committee tells of the conditions as found in different parts of the country. A special investigation was made of the jail in Jackson county. Whether or not the Jackson county jail comes up to the minimum standard is a question for the community to answer.

"There were five men in the four cells of the Jackson county jail when the inspection was made. The cells are 7 by 8 feet in size. Children are not kept in the jail. The prisoners have no regular occupation and the only exercise is allowed in the corridor. There seems to be no proper attempt to classify the prisoners. Only the sexes are separated.

"A small quantity of reading matter is furnished. There are no religious services held. Nothing is said of in and out fees.

"The cost of food is from 43 to 70 cents a day. The blankets on the canvas hammocks are washed when necessary and the prisoners' underclothing is changed weekly, the county furnishing the underclothing when necessary.

"The jail is supplied with water from a well, lighted by electricity, heated by stoves and ventilated by windows. There is only one closet in the jail and night buckets are also used. The building is said to be clean. There is very little plumbing in the jail and no baths exist."
