BARNUM'S FREIGHT RATES

The freight rates of the Rogue River Valley rail road is a question the people of this city are unable to solve. The company will charge \$5. for bringing an empty car from Medford here (we have not been able to learn whether they make an extra charge for placing the car on the sidetrack) the fruit men load the car and the company charges \$5. for hauling it over to Medford. The Southern Pacific spots a car on a siding for the shipper free of all expense and do not charge \$1.00 a mile for hauling the car. If they did the State Commerce Commission would have them before court and heavily fined.

Is it just?—Is it right for the people of this city to be persecuted by a man simply because he has the only means by which the citizens may reach the outside markets with his produce? That was what the State Railroad Commission was created for—to compel the railroads to make reasonable and equal rates.
