REASON

There seems to be some opposition to the proposed water system for this town. Why this opposition? One and all of us believe that Thomas A. Edison was a great inventor, but what would be his idea for laboring and studying if the people would not use his inventions? Where would the world be today if it were not for the encouragement given by its people to the inventive genius? A man may feel that his business ability is not equal to that of the more progressive individual and for that reason may seek to retard the progress of a community, by so doing he will not come in contact with the able business man.

Edison was not afraid to meet the world face to face and stand out as a man of ability, and is today considered a power along the lines of advancement. He did not have petty jealousy to contend with but found men who were ever ready to lend an encouraging hand.
