## GOOD SERVICE ON THE R. R. V. R. R.

Last Thursday the Warren Construction Co. wanted to ship a rock crusher over to the quarry in this city. The construction company had the crusher on a platform just outside of the city of Medford. The train pulled out of Medford on time and expected to stop at the platform to load this 5-ton crusher. The company had the crusher on rollers all ready to load on the flat car. Everything went all right until the heavy crusher was almost loaded when when the able railroad official who was assisting in the loading let the machine slip and fall on the track between the cars. This necessitated a delay and the passengers were loaded in automobiles and brought to this city.

This is another case of carelessness on the part of the officials and should not be longer tolerated by the traveling public.

Why should this company stop a regular passenger train on the main line to load heavy rock crusher weighing five tons? It is unreasonable and there is no legitimate excuse for the delay of this train.

Accidents are almost daily occurrences on this line but so far nothing more serious than a draw head pulling out on a moving train and tearing up about 200 feet of track, which might have resulted in a serious wreck.

The service afforded the public by this company is simply ROTTEN. They have not the slightest respect for the traveling public.

Is it possible that a human being could grow so blood thirsty as to prepare a death trap for the people who so faithfully furnish him his daily bread? If this is not a death trap I would like for someone better informed to tell me what it is, and it is conducted by human beings.

The District Attorney has instructions from the state railroad commission to investigate and take such action as he sees fit.

## DEMURER WAS ARGUED TUESDAY

A demurer was argued Tuesday afternoon before Circuit Judge Hanna in the case of J. F. Reddy, receiver of the Medford & Crater Lake Railroad, vs. A. A. Davis, et al.

The action was brought for the purpose of forcing holders of watered stock to pay for the same. Judge W. D. Fenton, of Portland, Geo. H. Durham, of Grants Pass and W. M. Colvig, of Medford represented A. A. Davis, et al., and Attorney A. E. Reames of this city, represented the plaintiff.

The Pacific & Eastern Railroad company bought the Medford & Crater Lake Railroad for \$81,500; this money was deposited with the Oregon Trust and Savings bank. After the failure of the Oregon Trust and Savings bank the certificates of deposits assets and liabilities were taken over by the German-American bank. The court allowed the latter two years in which to pay the \$81,500.

The court took the matter under advisement.
