Uncle Sam pays rent amounting to \$400,000 every year. And the burden is not even mitigated by the joy of being able to get out occasionally and hunt a flat.

"Why is it that nearly everybody who attends church likes to sit in the end of a seat and hold onto it like grim death and every person who gets a berth in that pew must stumble over them." Well, we confess we do that sort of a thing. It is to get out quickly in case of fire—we sinners are quite strongly reminded of fire flames and brimstone that is pursuing us, and we can't tell just exactly when it is going to come. We want to be in position to make a quick get-away.

The force of patent examiners in the patent office is composed of technically educated men. As soon as they become versed in patent office practice, their services are at once in great demand by the large manufacturing concerns, and also by the patent attorneys in the country. These outside firms and corporations are willing to pay much better salaries than the government gives them in their present situations. The result is that each year there is a large number of resignations. Last year over fifty skilled examiners resigned from the service, to enter into the employ of private concerns, at a large increase of salary. The government finds it almost impossible to keep these places filled, and the result has been that the work of the patent office has been put to great inconvenience by having to wait a long time before their applications are passed upon.

Very few people comparatively have any adequate idea of the immense cost of producing a modern daily newspaper, particularly in the large cities of the country. Some authentic figures on the subject have recently been made public and will doubtless occasion surprise to the uninformed. The "composition" (printers' weekly pay roll) for instance on the Boston American is \$2,000; on the Boston Globe, \$4,200; on the Globe Democrat, \$3,000; on the New York Herald, \$4,000; and other paper in proportion. Bills for special telegrams are another big item of expense. On the Chicago Herald a few years ago they run to \$4,000 per month; St. Louis Globe-Democrat, \$12,000; San Francisco Examiner, \$8,000; Boston Herald, \$6,000; and St. Louis Republic, \$4,000. Then there is the white paper bill which is greater than the others combined. On the New York World it is said to run \$700,000 per year and on the New York American about the same; on the Chicago News about \$250,000 and

on the Boston Globe and Herald about \$350,000 each; on the Enquirer about \$300,000, and on many other papers it runs from \$100,000 to a quarter of a million dollars every twelve months.

#### WILL IT BE DONE

At the Board meeting Tuesday night a petition was presented asking the board to remove the grand stand at the ball park and build a bridge across Jackson creek.

An ordinance was passed by the council in 1902 vacating this street. Thus that portion of the street now covered by the grand stand is the property of the abutting property owners and not the property of the city.

If the board orders this street opened at this point it will cost the taxpayers several thousand dollars. What is the use? The street is over thirty feet wide at this point now, and there is little or no traffic on this street, and, if this obstruction was removed and a bridge built traffic would be very light over the street at the point of the grand stand.

The expense of moving the grand stand and building the bridge would run near \$10,000.00. Spend this \$10,000.00 on paved streets in Jacksonville and I venture to say that Jacksonville will be better off.

A man cannot succeed, in this day and age in any business unless he carries a liberal advertisement in his local paper, it matters not whether he has a monopoly on his particular business venture or not. Did you ever think of this?
