TO ASSURE PEACE

At the annual meeting of the Naval League, held at Kiel, recently, prominent German officers present declared the need of a large navy to assure the maintenance of peace.

Prince Henry of Prussia, representing his brother Emperor William, voiced the general sentiment in these words: "This organization should devote itself to the furthering and carrying out of the legal naval program. In addition to a powerful army we need a large fleet in order to assure peace."

The foregoing reminds us strongly of the old frontiersman who declared, "I am a man of peace and will have peace even if I have to kill three men to secure it."

GOING SOME

Some years ago Jules Verne, the French novelist published "Around the World in Eighty Days," a novel describing an imaginary trip around the globe made in what was then deemed an incredibly short time. Later on the feat was accomplished by Nellie Bly with some time to spare but a statement made at the meeting of the Transcontinental Passenger Association, held in Seattle this week declares that such a trip can now be made in 41 days.

The association ordered a schedule for around the world traffic prepared. The rates will vary from \$630 to \$800 for the round trip.

The proposed amendments to the City Charter appear in full in this issue of The Post and should receive a careful reading by every citizen of the town. The various changes and new provisions are the result of much careful study and patient investigation by the trustees and Attorney Hanna who has devoted considerable time to looking up different legal authorities upon the subjects involved.
