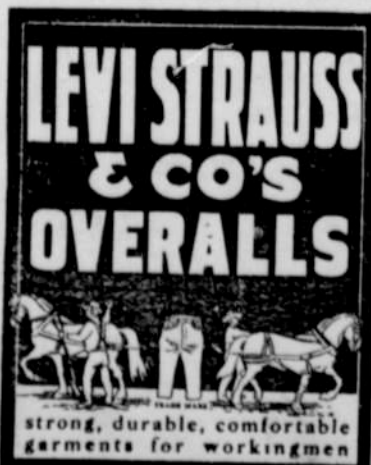
Messrs. Randall and Iddings, of the Rogue River Valley Orchards Company are up from San Francisco, looking after their interests here, and are accompanied by their families.
