Going North the Portland Express only makes the larger town stops. No. 13 however makes about same stops as formerly. For additional information as to what trains stop at different points call at or phone the depot.

The coach heretofore carried on No. 225 is discontinued, local freights will pass Medford during the day instead of night as heretofore. The above is the best mail service and train service Rogue River Valley ever had, letters mailed in Portland before 5:30 P.M. will reach Medford 5:50 following morning. Trains 11, 12, 13, 14, alone carry United States Mail.
