#### THE WATER SUPPLY

The city council are wise in deciding upon further investigation of Jackson creek as a source of supply for the proposed water system.

If the supply of water to be obtained in Jackson creek is found to be sufficient for the demands likely to be made upon it there can be many reasons adduced for its use, such as better sanitation, saving in expenses of operation' etc.

There is scarcely a person in the city but would prefer to see the water taken from some stream or spring with elevation sufficient to give proper pressure without pumping. Although the expense of installation, owing to a greater length of supply pipes may be greater for gravity system than for a well and pumping plant, the gravity system will be found cheaper in the end, besides being far preferable and much more satisfactory to the users.

Thorough examination and tests should be made now, it is better to delay a short time than to rush the construction of a system which may prove unsatisfactory in later years and necessitate expensive changes.

The inhabitants of Jacksonville are entitled to the best water obtainable and at a moderate cost.
