Rogue River apples were given deserved recognition at Spokane last week when a carload, grown by Tronson & Guthrie won the Sweepstakes prize over all competitors, carrying with it the title of "Apple King", a title well earned and highly prized, the right to which will be maintained by the excellence of our orchard products.

FIRST PRIZES Won by Rogue River Apples At Spokane.

The Rogue River Valley carried off the highest honors at the National Apple Show at Spokane last week. The victory is one that cannot but result in a widespread boast of this valley as an apple growing region and place it at the very head of the districts in the Northwest. Of the thirteen carlots exhibited at the Show, two came from the Rogue River valley, one from the Tronson & Guthrie orchard, near Eagle Point, and the other from the Chas. Pope orchard in the foothills just west of Ashland. Though both the cars from this valley could not carry off a grand prize, for there was but one, still they seem to have swept everything before them. The Eagle Point car was awarded the grand prize of \$1,000 for the best car of any kind of apples exhibited. A prize of \$250 was also offered for the best car of Spitz and this will naturally fall to it along with the grand prize. The Ashland car was awarded the first place for the best carlot of Newtons exhibited. Inasmuch as the Spitz and Newtons are the acknowledged leaders among commercial apples the victory has an added significance for this valley.

Tronson & Guthrie have won further honors for this valley by taking first prize for their 3-box exhibit of Spitz-enbergs in the western special exhibit, when their apples were placed in competition with hundreds of exhibits from western states—Oregon, Washington, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, Montana, Idaho and California. This victory means as much or more than winning the sweepstakes, for the car met 13 competitors, the 3-box exhibit hundreds. The following second prizes were won by residents of the valley:
Ashland, second prize on 10-box ex-

hibit of Spitz-enbergs.
Ashland, third prize on 10-box exhibit of Newton Pippins.
J. A. Westerlund, second prize on plate display of Newtons, among 42 competitors.
