57 YEARS AGO. First Thanksgiving Proclamation in Oregon.

By the Governor of the Territory of Oregon: The year now drawing to a close has been one of general prosperity to the citizens of Oregon Territory. The blessings of Divine Providence have been abundantly vouchsafed to all classes of our population. Our ample harvest has required the labor of the husbandman. The mechanic, the merchant and the professional man have alike successfully pursued their avocations, while "the pestilence that walketh in darkness and the destruction that wasteth at noon-day" have not been allowed to devastate our rising country. We have been generally exempted from wars within our own limits, and the Federal Republic has gone forward in her glorious career of moral and intellectual progress, unobstructed by any untoward event. In addition to these general occasions for gratitude we have special cause of congratulation in the advancement of science and of virtue in our midst. It is fitting that we should, as a people, acknowledge our obligations and render our thanks to the gracious Author of our mercies. In conformity to a usage in most of the states of our Union, I, John P. Gaines, do hereby appoint the second Thursday in December next to be set apart as a day of public thanksgiving to Almighty God, and invite all the citizens of the territory to suspend their usual business and observe the day in appropriate religious exercises.
