A private irrigation project is about to commence operations three miles above Weston, Umatilla county. The reservoir will cost a quarter of a million, and the lands irrigated are now rich rolling wheat farms for the most part. When completed the town of Weston will find it a far greater booster than ever was the normal school.
