The White Swan mine, near Baker City, reported to have thousands of stockholders over the country, was sold at sheriff's sale for \$1500 Monday.

John B. Brown, who operated the first railway mail car in the United States, died at Ashland, recently.

Miller Bros. of Milton, shipped 1000 apple trees to Austria, this week.

An old frame building which for many years done service as a schoolhouse, was sold at Freewater Monday. The building sold for \$330.

Marion Irrigation company, with a capital of \$250,000, has been organized to develop 40,000 acres of land along the Willamette valley.

Tronson & Guthrie of Eagle Point, have just sold a carload of Spitzbergen apples at an average of \$2.75 l. o. b. Eagle Point. The car was about half and half, firsts and seconds.

C. D. Hull, aged 25, of Forest Grove, was killed at Georgetown, Wash. Monday, by an electric shock followed by a fall of 75 feet to the floor of the building in which he was working.

Four persons were drowned in the Columbia river near Rainier, Sunday morning. They were returning in a launch from Rainier to Maggers when the boat turned turtle, spilling the party into the river. There were 7 persons in the launch, three of whom were rescued.
