The Pacific's Future.

With the assurance that the Pullman company will build on San Francisco bay, and possibly near Richmond, a car manufacturing plant which will cost \$200,000,000 and will be the largest plant in the world, comes again the thought of the possibilities of the Pacific of the future, for verily, the broad Pacific ocean is to see changes of which the average man never dreams. Men connected with the Pullman company say that they can ship iron ore cheaper in large quantities from Birmingham, Alabama, via the Panama canal (when that waterway is completed) than they can ship it to Pullman, Illinois, which means that the great bulk of the thousands of cars manufactured every year will be put out at or near the City of the Sunset Sea. And this is only a beginning of the movement for the great enterprises that will dot the shores of the great ocean where will be built up the greatest commerce the world has ever known.

The two largest freighters afloat, the Minnesota and the South Dakota, owned by the Hill interests, ply between Puget Sound and the Orient, and before we who are young now reach middle-life will see the largest passenger ships afloat—possibly over 1000 feet in length—plowing the Pacific. San Francisco, Oakland, Alameda, Berkeley, Richmond and other Bay Cities will be under one municipal government and one will be able to get on a street car in San Francisco and ride to Richmond without transferring, going either over or under the bay. The new (or greater) San Francisco will be one of the largest cities of the world, as will also the principal city of Puget Sound. Where there is one ship on the ocean now, there will be scores of them, and the thousands of miles of shore washed

by the Pacific, with the millions of people on continent and island, producing everything necessary for the world's population, will take part in an era of development, the fruits of which would startle us in our dreams today.—Ex.
