THE "DEVIL" OBJECTS.

The Portland Oregonian in a recent issue devotes considerable of its valuable space to an article intended to ridicule the people of Southern Oregon and Northern California in general and the Press Association in particular. The article in question is simply twaddle of the silliest kind, without point or bearing on the subject its author pretends to discuss; people who heretofore never favored the division of the state may now be moved to advocate division in order to escape from a jurisdiction containing such imbeciles as the author of the effusion referred to.

In regard to the sneering allusion to "the printer's devil from Jacksonville" we feel like the boy who was kicked by a jackass, and consider the source, but will say that if our devil, or any employee of this office would offer such a screed for publication he would be promptly fired, possibly to obtain a situation upon the editorial staff of the Oregonian.

In his practical little book, "The Garden Yard," Bolton Hall says that if New York state was as thickly populated as the island of Guernsey, off the English coast, it would have three times the population of the entire United States. There would seem to be plenty of land in the United States, and in Oregon the fertile soil and mild climate would indicate that we should have room for half the population of the United States. But we would have to have more five-acre farms than donation claims of 640 acres each.

The Supreme Court of Oregon has rendered a decision confirming the right of Milwaukie to a five-cent fare. The court as at present constituted stands by the people whenever it can. Efforts are going to be made next year to get a majority of corporation attorneys on it. The people need to look carefully to the nominations made next year for filling the four vacancies that will exist.

The Circuit Court.

The Circuit Court for Jackson county convened as per adjournment, Monday morning at 10 o'clock. The first case tried was that of Grace vs. McDowell, an action to enforce the performance of a specific contract. It appeared that in 1908, the defendant, McDowell employed the plaintiff to sell a tract of land in Sama Valley, for which service the plaintiff was to receive all money or other property above the value of \$3,000. In case of an exchange the property was to be considered as valued at the price agreed upon at the time at the exchange; plaintiff alleging

that defendant and the parties with whom the exchange was made had valued the property at \$13,200. This was denied by the defendant, who claimed the value was \$9,000. A number of witnesses were examined on each side, occupying the time until Tuesday noon. At 1:30 the case was submitted to the jury and after being out a short time a verdict was rendered for the plaintiff in the amount claimed.

CRESCENT CITY HARBOR

Best Between Puget Sound and San Diego -- Would Shelter Half the Shipping of the World

Now that the proposed railroad from this valley seems to have assumed a definite shape, the following extract from an article in the Del Norte Record, in regard to the harbor at Crescent City, will be of interest to our readers here and elsewhere. The article in part is as follows:

For the past two years this office has been furnishing interested parties maps of Crescent City Harbor, showing depths of water, etc., and were advised that the harbor would be improved. Last summer a party from Medford, Oregon, looked over this section as far north as Chasco, Oregon, in the interest of a railroad to the coast and we were asked to withhold the object of their visit; that later on all would be known.

At this time it will not be amiss to mention that for years there have been attempts to have Crescent City Harbor improved but for some reason, best known to the Engineer's Department, the government never took action, though reported on favorably. In all petitions a harbor of refuge was asked for, for the benefit of coastwise shipping in particular.

At the present time, ships bearing 14 feet of water load at the dock, which has been extended westerly to Flat Rock, which does not show in the picture. It must be remembered that this is an open port and there is always more or less swell coming in and a vessel drawing 14 feet requires considerable depth of water.

One of the prominent Engineers some years ago when asked as to which place along the coast would make the best and largest harbor; replied that he had examined every port from San Diego to Puget Sound and for the amount to be expended in building a breakwater Crescent City was the place. His plan was to build southerly from Lighthouse Island a mile or two which would give shelter to half the shipping of the world.
