The Medford Mail Tribune in a recent issue, speaking of the advantage of good roads, says in part: "It only needs a demonstration of the advantages of good roads to make everyone want them.

The methods of building roads in Jackson county are wrong. It has been thoroughly demonstrated that gravel is almost worthless in comparison with crushed rock. The \$79,000 spent last year upon the roads has not brought \$79,000 worth of results, and the highways will never be satisfactorily constructed until modern methods are adopted.

One mile of good road will have the same effect upon the county that one paved street has had upon Medford, and it would not be long until every section was clamoring for it."

While we do not quite agree with the Tribune that the \$79,000 spent last year upon roads has not brought \$79,000 worth of results, (we claim every dollar expended in a proper manner upon the roads will yield two-fold value to the taxpayers of the county) we do agree to the statement that a demonstration of the advantages arising from good roads will prove their value and suggest that such demonstration be made on the road between this city and Medford. Then if found desirable, the system can be extended to cover the principal roads of the county.

CIRCUIT COURT (Adjourned Session)

The Circuit Court was convened in adjourned session Monday morning. A number of cases were called and disposed of as follows:

State of Oregon vs. George Putnam. Dismissed for want of prosecution.

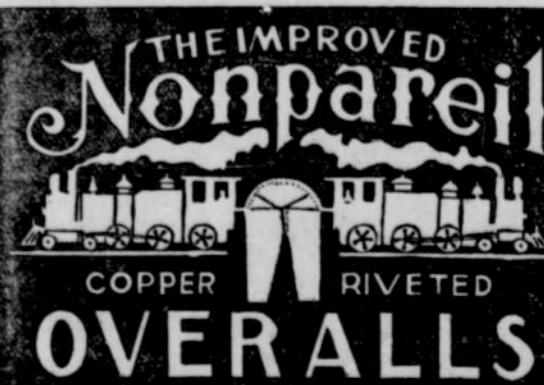
