The time for the city election is drawing near; in addition to the candidates named at the mass meeting last week three additional names have been added by petitions, as provided in the city charter.

The ticket as it stands now is: For Mayor, T. T. Shaw; for Councilmen, Emil Britt, C. F. Dunford, Fred Fick and Wm. T. Grieves; for Recorder, B. M. Collins and H. G. Dox; for Treasurer, James Cronmiller; for Marshal, John Huffer and M. D. Jones; for Street Commissioner, James Young and B. E. Haney.

As the charter allows the filing of nomination papers up to seven days prior to the election, candidates have until Monday evening in which to file certificates or petitions, and it is possible, though scarcely probable that more names will be added to the list.

The candidates named are all good men, qualified for the positions, most of them have been tried in the positions for which they have been named, and it is up to the voters to choose as they may deem proper.

The Albany Herald publishes a letter from a subscriber in another state in which he says:
