

Newspapermen Arrested.

A. E. Verhies, proprietor, and C. G. Coutant, editor, of the Rogue River Courier were arrested Monday afternoon on a charge of alleged criminal libel.

The complaint was sworn to by County Judge Stephen A. Jewell, who is the complaining witness, and whose complaint charges the defendants with publishing libelous matter in the paper on February 11, charging the county court with taking "rave" without permission of private premises.

A preliminary hearing will be had next Wednesday before Justice Holman. All parties concerned are prominent citizens.

It is stated that trouble over the price of county printing led to the publication of the article in question.
