The citizens of Jacksonville at the polls Tuesday plainly expressed their desire to place this city on a level with the more progressive cities of the state. By re-electing Mayor Shaw and the old board of councilmen a step was taken in the right direction. To oust the old board at this time would have been not only an undeserved injury to themselves, but a distinct blow to the welfare of the city. A new board would have required time to pick up the threads of business and work harmoniously together; the old board has everything well in hand and can now proceed with a dispatch which would have been impossible for new officials to attain.

We predict that before another municipal election rolls around, the voters of Jacksonville will have cause to congratulate themselves on their choice.

It is the concensus of opinion that with the present councilmen returned to office, a water system, sewerage, paving and street improvements—the most pressing necessities of the city—are possibilities of the near future. While it is undeniable that it requires time, both in planning and the actual construction of such substantial improvements as those intended for Jacksonville, still, with another year before them, the present officials are in a position to and doubtless will accomplish a great deal. Given an unflinching water supply and clean streets Jacksonville's future is assured.
