We have received a copy of H. R. 21761, a bill introduced by Mr. Hawley, on February 24, providing for the opening to settlement of the Klamath Indian Reservation, in Oregon, and for other purposes.

While as yet we have been able to give only a hurried examination to the proposed measure, we find that it covers the ground pretty thoroughly, providing for the allotment of lands to all Indians who are entitled to the same, also providing for setting aside sites for public buildings, water works, etc. and for the appraising and disposal of the remainder.

The bill has been referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered printed. Citizens of the state should write our representatives at Washington urging the immediate passage of this bill, as it is an undisputed fact that the opening of the Klamath Reservation will be a benefit to the whole state adding largely to the population and advancement thereof.
