The "assembly plan" may be a good one if kept within proper limitations, that is, such a system may be advisable for the purpose of formulating party platforms, etc. and for keeping up the party organizations, but when it is used for naming, or even suggesting candidates for the different offices it savors too highly of bossism and ring rule and means practically a return to the old evils which the direct primary was intended to correct. If the gentlemen who so strongly advocate the assembly plan desire to use it for placing the party principles before the public, etc. well and good; but every attempt to use it as a nominating convention should be promptly snubbed.
