While the primary law of Oregon may be defective in some particulars, it seems to us much better to maintain the principle of the direct primary and amend the law where it is found defective, rather than to return to the convention system. It will be found upon careful investigation that nine-tenths of the party bosses are opposed to the direct primary. The reason for their opposition is obvious; under the convention system their rule was universal and their power absolute, going to the length of naming candidates days before the conventions were held. The progressive element is equally united in support of the principle of direct nominations. We quote from a recent article in La Follette's Weekly, as follows:

"Primary elections are securely established in the Middle West. Public sentiment will not permit a return to the cut-and-dried convention system. Serious discussion in these States is concerned not so much with the principle of direct nominations as with ways and means of perfecting and strengthening the laws now in force."

Alexandria, Egypt, March 30.—Ex-President Roosevelt bade farewell to Egypt this afternoon, sailing at 2 o'clock on the liner Prinz Heinrich for Naples. Before his departure he sent a telegraph message to the khedive, thanking him for courtesies enjoyed in Egypt. Former President Roosevelt and his party left at 4:45 o'clock this morning for Alexandria. He will sail today from Alexandria for Naples, where he will arrive Saturday. When the party left today there was no reminder of yesterday's Nationalist demonstration. The station was crowded with the former president's friends, who gave him a hearty send off.
