The decision by the supreme court this week, in the Hanley water case puts the matter upon the same basis that it stood upon a year ago, and the city of Medford after wasting a year's time and spending considerable money is confronted by the same obstacles as before. It has the choice of two ways out of the difficulty; either compromise and settle with Hanley, or bring another suit. It would have been better in the first place, to have compromised, and such course would no doubt have been considerably cheaper for the city in the end, to say nothing of the value of the use of the pipe line while the matter has been in controversy. It is hoped that the city council of Jacksonville will profit by Medford's example and avoid all litigation in obtaining right of way for the new water system.

The question of a franchise for the new telephone company will likely be definitely settled to-night by the council, it being generally understood that the consideration of that matter is to be the principal business before the council to-night. While there are two sides to this question [like most others], and some good arguments can be produced on either side, the matter has been pretty well threshed out, it is up to the council to settle the matter one way or another.
