County Hospital report for month of April presented and approved.

Salary of the janitor at the court house increased from \$45. to \$60. per month.

In the matter of the road petitioned for by E. S. Foss and others. Report of viewers was rejected and viewers discharged. New board of viewers appointed.

The appointment of J. H. Carlton as deputy assessor, approved.

In matter of the road petitioned for by A. L. Scholl, et al. Ordered that petition be dismissed.

The petition for the incorporating of the Town of Woodville, came up regularly for hearing, and it was ordered that an election be held June 2.

In the matter of the road petitioned for by John Cadzow and others. Report of viewers accepted and petition dismissed, the petitioners to bear the expenses of surveying and viewing the road.

The petition of T. J. Parton, et al. for road was dismissed.

In matter of road petitioned for by F. W. Sifers et al. Order appointing viewers to survey and view said road.

The petition of Sarah A. Hull for a change of road over her own land, was considered and viewers appointed.

The bids for the construction of the bridge at Phoenix, and one near Ashland were rejected, and the clerk instructed to advertise for new bids.

## Murder Made Easy

It is a pity that we cannot avoid such palpable miscarriage of justice as that which is involved in the determination of the Wezler case. A man harboring bitter resentment against his wife and his mother-in-law, holding that the latter is largely responsible for his domestic troubles which have deprived him of his children, whom he professes to love dearly, he talks of killing; finally he sends a decoy letter to the mother-in-law, inducing her thereby to journey to a distant and lonely spot, where he meets her, has some argument with her, and then shoots her to death. There is trial of the case, and upon the plea of no premeditation a verdict of murder in the second degree is the result.

A bare recital of the circumstances in such a case is sufficient comment, so far as the fact that there has been a miscarriage of justice is concerned. What may be done or what should be done to avoid this sort of thing is extremely problematical.

This case is but one of hundreds that have arisen from time to time, wherein verdicts have been entirely at variance with any common-sense acceptance and interpretation of the facts. It represents a class of cases that seem to go off by virtue of the sophistry of the lawyer rather than by the observance of sound and serviceable rules of law. It is a case wherein if guilt had been denied there could have been,

or at least there should have been, but one of two conclusions, either guilty in the first degree or not guilty. But guilt was not denied, and for the reason that the proofs were so strong denial was useless.

It is to be regretted that the law is not so formed as suitable to such cases that the court can instruct the jury there can be no middle or compromise ground; for such outcome is encouragement to crime of this type.—Ex.

Edward VII, king of England, died Friday evening after a short illness, at the age of 69 years. Edward reigned over the British empire for nine years, succeeding his mother, Queen Victoria, in 1901. His eldest son, the Prince of Wales, was proclaimed king Saturday morning, as King George V.
