Obituary.

Mr. Rial Benedict one of Oregon's oldest pioneers has just passed away at his home on the Applegate, at the ripe old age of 89 years. He was born in New York State on the 21st of March 1821. He was married to Miss Mary I. Cogle in 1848 and about the year 1851 with his wife and some others set out to cross the plains by ox train to Oregon. He settled in Corvallis till 1854 when he moved to Applegate after a short time he returned to Illinois by way of Panama and New York. The charm of the West had so much power over him that in 1859 he again purchased ox teams and wagons and once more ventured out on that long, tedious and perilous journey. After enduring many dangers and mishaps he at length arrived on Applegate in the fall of 1859 where he lived till the day of his death.

In 1884 he was again married, to Miss Electa Knight who died March 12th, 1909, of this union a son Mr. Fred Benedict and a daughter Mrs. Anna Mansfield are left to mourn his death. During a period extending beyond the allotted span of three score years and ten he lived an upright moral life and went down to the grave full of years and honor followed by the respect and regard of all who knew him. He was a member of the Pioneers Society of Oregon. We who are left can with truth and much justice say: "Our valley teems with beauty now, Great plenty crowns our cheer; Give honor to whom honor's due, The brave old Pioneer."

In these days of luxury and prosperity we are prone to forget how much we owe to these gallant men and women whom one by one we are laying aside for a well earned rest. We pour into this state to-day on our steam cars, our electric and our gasoline cars, our hotels, our churches, our schools, our hotels, our laws, and our good roads, if we fail to see a house every eight or ten miles we think we are in a desert while there are some in our midst who remember when there was scarcely a dwelling west of the Missouri River, yet for all this we are likely to forget the dangers, the hardships, the suffering, the disappointments and the cruel treacherous deaths that were suffered by those who have made our rolling meadows, our prolific orchards and our flourishing towns not only possible but an accomplished fact. We may forget all this, we may be too busy to think of it but there is one who always remembers and never will forget the men who blazed the trail and then stood aside to watch the tide of progress cover up their footsteps.
