Those who failed to attend the good roads meeting certainly missed a treat. Mr. Eldridge is one of the best informed men on the subject of road building, in America, and showed by illustration and argument the necessity and advantages of building roads according to a well settled plan, upon proper foundations, of material of proper sizes, well packed, and bound together by finer crushed rock, the whole structure slightly crowning in the center so as to drain the water into the ditches alongside the road which do not necessarily have to be deep canals, but only of sufficient size and depth to carry the surface water and keep the roadbed dry. He illustrated by pictures from actual photographs, the difference, in appearance of, and in ease of travel over, roads properly constructed and those not properly made, and urged the necessity of some supervising and directing head, or authority over the road work done in each state.

## GOOD ROADS MEETING

Expert from Washington D. C. shows some advantages of good roads.—Judge Webster delivers interesting address.

The good roads meeting advertised for Thursday night was held in the U. S. Hall, and although the attendance was not nearly as large as it should have been, the deficiency in numbers was more than made up by interest and attention displayed by the audience. Mr. M. W. Eldridge, an expert sent out by the Good Roads division of the Department of Agriculture, at Washington, delivered an interesting lecture showing by pictures, the development and evolution of road building from the construction of the ancient Roman roads, up to the present day. Following this was a series of pictures, taken from actual photographs, showing in a manner impossible to express in mere words the contrast between bad roads and good ones; in many instances the pictures showed the road "before and after" taking the "good roads" treatment. It was an object lesson which appealed to every one present. Judge Webster of Portland, who by the way was a former resident of this city, and is very enthusiastic regarding the future of Jackson county, followed in an interesting and instructive address, lasting for more than an hour, described in glowing terms the benefits which would accrue to this valley and the whole state of Oregon from the construction of proper and permanent roads. The speaker urged the importance of immediate action and advised the amendment of the constitution allowing the bonding of the different counties for this purpose. At the close of his address the speaker asked that a branch of the Oregon Good Roads Association be formed in this county.
