

NEW STRIKE

In Alaska-Quartz dyke 40 miles long, near Seward.

Seattle, Wash., June 14.—A new bonanza gold field, with quartz assaying from \$30 to \$75 a ton, has been discovered in the Bonfield district, 300 miles north of Seward, Alaska, according to letters received here today from A. W. Swantz, chief engineer of the Alaska Northern Railway. The new bonanza, according to the letter, is a quartz dyke, running 40 miles east and west and easily accessible from Seward. "All statements agree that there exists along the south slope of the East Fork of the Central Alaska Range, between Broad Pass and Mount Hayes, a quartz dyke running about 40 miles east and west," writes Mr. Swantz. "It seems to be a new Rand, a quartz district of the greatest promise. There are now 35 prospectors at work in that section, in the employ of wealthy and experienced Fairbanks miners. The ores, so far, have assayed from \$30 to \$75 in value, with occasional richer veins protruding. The known auriferous gravels along the Cantwell, Tatanika and Clear Creeks have probably originated there."

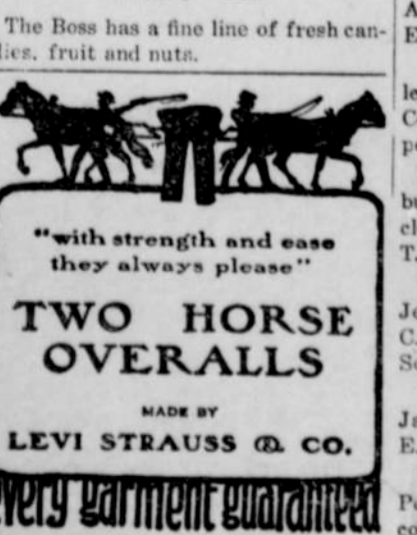

California Oil After gushing for more than two years, the past year at a steady, 1500 barrel clip, No. 1 well of the Palmer Oil Company, in the Santa Maria fields, has suddenly begun to spout at a greatly increased rate and for several days has been producing 2,000 barrels a day.

No. 2 well of Palmer company, which came in as a gusher a couple of weeks ago, sanded up last week, but has been cleaned out and is now under control, being permitted to flow only in such quantities as can be handled by the Union and Associated pipe lines.

News of the bringing in of another big gusher is momentarily expected from the Santa Maria fields, where the New Pennsylvania Oil Company has just finished a well at 3,555 feet. Fearing that the well will gush and get beyond control before storage facilities can be provided, water is being pumped into the well, but despite the 3,500 foot column of water the gas pressure is so great that oil is being forced over the casing-head at the rate of about 200 barrels a day. When the water pressure is removed it is expected that the well will start to gush at a terrific rate. The bringing in of this well is a very important development in the Santa Maria fields, as it proves the productiveness of a large additional area.

The Union Oil Company has just completed the building of a reservoir with a capacity of 2,500,000 barrels and has begun the construction of an earthen reservoir, with a capacity of 6,000,000 barrels, six miles from the Lakeview gusher. This reservoir is to be built in a canyon and will be fortified against the inflow of the winter rains and excessive evaporation.
