The Republican State Assembly was held in Portland this week attended by a number of delegates from almost all counties of the state. After some preliminary conferences with certain "rulers", a full ticket was named, and "recommended" to the Republican voters. But just why this recommendation should have any weight with the voters is not clear. The direct primary law in force in this state specifically provides the manner in which nominations shall be made, and the attempt of an assembly [composed of men in many instances elected or appointed by themselves] to dictate to the voters of the state who shall, or who shall not be voted for is absurd and ridiculous in the extreme. Every properly qualified elector of the state of Oregon has a perfect right to be a candidate for any office within the gift of the people, a right which cannot be impaired or abridged by assemblies or rings. The merits of the candidates should be decided at the primary as provided by law, by the majority vote of the people.

ORDINANCE NO. 131.

An Ordinance Ordering and Requiring the Construction of Artificial Stone Sidewalks along and fronting on all property which is adjacent to or abuts upon either side of OREGON STREET between Main and "C" Streets, on CALIFORNIA STREET between Oregon and Fifth Streets and on FIFTH STREET between California and "D" Streets herein specifying the Material, Location, Grade, Width, Manner and Time of Construction and Everything Requisite and necessary for an Intelligent Apprehension of the Sidewalk Required also herein Requiring and Providing Notice of said Order.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE DO ORDAIN as follows:

SECTION I.

That it is hereby declared to be the duty of all owners of land adjoining and abutting on the streets, avenues and alleys and other thoroughfares within the several districts named and described in Section II of this Ordinance to build, lay and construct cement or artificial stone sidewalks in accordance with the specifications and requirements herein contained and referred to. And the City Council hereby deems and declares the construction of said sidewalks proper, necessary, expedient and convenient for public welfare and the construction of the same is hereby Ordered and directed and notice of said order is hereby given.

SECTION II.

STREETS.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to the land and owners of land adjacent and abutting upon the following described streets or parts thereof, to-wit:

Each side of Oregon Street from the North line of Main Street to the South line of "C" Street.

Each side of California Street from the east line of Oregon Street to the west line of Fifth Street.

The west side of Fifth Street from the north line of California Street to the South line of "C" Street.

The east side of Fifth Street from the north line of California Street to the South line of "D" Street.

SECTION III.

LOCATION.

The outer or street edge of said sidewalks including curb shall conform and coincide with the respective boundary lines of said respective streets along which said sidewalk is constructed as designated and described particularly in ordinance No. 130 passed on the 5th day of July, A. D. 1910, and to which Ordinance notice is hereby especially directed.

SECTION IV.

MATERIAL.

Said sidewalks must be cement or artificial stone sidewalks and must be constructed in the manner and in accordance with the specifications and requirements of said Ordinance 130, to which Ordinance notice is hereby especially directed.

SECTION V.

GRADE.

Said sidewalks and curb shall be laid according to the grade stakes to be set by the City Engineer and which grade shall be calculated in the manner provided in Ordinance No 130, to which notice is hereby especially directed.

SECTION VI.

WIDTH.

The sidewalks including curbs upon those portions of California and Oregon Streets designated in Section II of this Ordinance shall be uniformly eight feet wide, excepting from East line of 4th St. to West line of Fifth St. which shall be 6 feet and no curb, and the sidewalk upon that portion of Fifth Street designated in said Section II, shall be six feet wide.

SECTION VII.

ENTRANCES TO CELLARS OR BASEMENTS. In all cases where the entrances to cellars or basements are made from

the sidewalks, the door or doors leading thereto shall be made of iron or other equally substantial metal and shall be so constructed as to be flush with the surface of the finished sidewalk and shall open upward and outward. Said entrances and doors shall not be of greater dimensions than 3ft. by 4½ ft. Said doors shall be placed in position under the supervision of the City Engineer.

SECTION VIII.

TIME.

Said sidewalks must be constructed in accordance with the requirements of this Order and Ordinance within 30 days from the date of the service of this notice and order as required by Chapter XV of the City Charter.

SECTION IX.

SERVICE.

The City Marshal is hereby required and directed to make service of this order and notice upon all persons upon whom such service is required by the provisions of Chapter XV of the City Charter in the manner therein required and to make due return of his said service.

SECTION X.

CITY ENGINEER.

The City Engineer is hereby ordered and directed to establish the grade and grade stakes of said sidewalks and to locate the boundary lines thereof and to generally supervise and inspect the construction thereof as required under the provisions of Ordinance No. 130.

SECTION XI.

All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed in so far as they conflict herewith.

Notice of Special Election for the City of Jacksonville, Oregon.

Notice is hereby given that under and in pursuance of an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, passed and approved, on the 13th day of July, 1910, ordering a submission unto the legal voters of the said City of Jacksonville, Ordinance No. 129, a copy of which is hereto attached and made a part hereof, passed by the City Council ordering and authorizing the issuance of bonds of the said City of Jacksonville, in the sum of \$30,000.00 for the purpose of establishing a water system for the said city and for the purpose of furnishing water to the city, citizens, and inhabitants of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, a Special Election will be held within the corporate limits of the said City of Jacksonville Oregon, at the City Hall thereof on the 1st day of August, 1910, between the hours of 10 o'clock A. M. and 4 o'clock P. M. of said date for the purpose of submitting to the qualified bond voters of the said City of Jacksonville, the question of whether the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, shall issue bonds of the said City of Jacksonville, Oregon, for the purpose of establishing a water system for the said city, and for the purpose of furnishing water to the City, citizens and inhabitants of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon. The estimated cost of the said water system is \$30,000.00. Vote Yes or No—If in favor of bonds vote Yes, if opposed vote No.

ORDINANCE NO. 129.

An ordinance authorizing the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, to issue bonds of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, to the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars, with interest thereon at the rate of Six per cent per annum, from the date of sale of the same, interest payable semi-annually, and providing for the time and manner of payment of the said bonds, and providing for a special election for submitting the question of the issuance of said bonds to the legal voters of the said City of Jacksonville, for the purpose of providing water for the use of the inhabitants of, and citizens of, and City of Jacksonville, Oregon.

The People of the City of Jacksonville, Do Ordain as Follows:

SECTION I.

That for the purpose of providing water for the use of the inhabitants of, citizens of, and City of Jacksonville, Oregon, and for the purpose of contracting for constructing, maintaining, owning, managing, and operating a system of water works, with all the necessary implements and appliances for the purpose of supplying water to the city, citizens of, and inhabitants of the said City of Jacksonville, Oregon, and for the purpose of buying, leasing or contracting for property within or outside the said City of Jacksonville, Oregon, for the said purpose of constructing, maintaining, owning, managing and operating the said proposed system of water works, and for the purchase of all necessary implements and appliances for the supply of water to the said city, citizens and inhabitants of the said city of Jacksonville, Oregon, and for the purpose of contracting for procuring and purchasing or otherwise obtaining for the said purpose of providing water for the use of the said

City, and the inhabitants and citizens thereof, the waters of any stream, spring or well, there is hereby authorized and ordered to be issued the bonds of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, to the amount of (\$30,000.00) Thirty Thousand Dollars, to be issued in denominations of (\$500.00) Five Hundred Dollars, and shall be known as the Jacksonville, Oregon, Water Works Bonds, and shall draw interest at the rate of Six per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually.

SECTION II.

Said bonds shall be numbered from one to sixty and shall be issued in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars. Said bonds shall become due and payable in Twenty Years from date of issue.

SECTION III.

The bonds hereby authorized shall be substantially in the following form; No. _____ State of Oregon, City of Jacksonville, Jacksonville, Oregon, Water Works Bond.

Know all men by these Presents, that the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, for value received, acknowledges it owes and hereby promises to pay to the bearer the sum of Five Hundred Dollars in Gold Coin of the United States of America, at the present standard of weight and fineness, upon the presentation and surrender of this bond on the _____ day of _____, 19—, due and payable absolutely on that date, with interest thereon at the rate of Six per cent, per annum, interest payable semi-annually in like coin, on the _____ day of _____, in each year, upon presentation and surrender of the proper interest coupon annexed hereto, as they respectively mature.

This bond is one of a series of like bonds, numbering from one to sixty, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars, issued under and in pursuance of, and in full compliance with the City Charter of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, and of an election duly called and held on the 1st day of August, 1910, and it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done and performed precedent to, and in the issuance of said bonds, have been properly done, happened and performed in regular and due time, form and manner, as required by law; and that the total indebtedness of said City of Jacksonville, including this series of bonds, does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limitations; and for the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this bond, the faith and credit of the said City of Jacksonville, are hereby irrevocably pledged. In witness whereof this bond has been signed by the Mayor and City Recorder of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, with the titles of their respective offices affixed, and under the seal of the said City of Jacksonville, on this _____ day of _____, 1910.

The City of Jacksonville, Oregon, will pay to the bearer at the office of the City Treasurer, in Jacksonville, Oregon, \$15.00 in Gold Coin of the

United States of America at the present standard of weight and fineness on the _____ day of _____, and on the _____ day of _____, being the semi-annual interest due on Jacksonville, Oregon, Water Bond No. _____

City Recorder _____ Mayor.

SECTION IV.

A Special election in and for the said City of Jacksonville, is hereby directed, authorized and ordered to be held at regular polling place within the said City of Jacksonville, Oregon, at the City Hall on the 1st day of August, 1910, between the hours of 10 o'clock A. M. and 4 o'clock P. M. of said day at which time there shall be submitted to the qualified bond voters of the said City of Jacksonville, Oregon, the question of the issuance of the bonds herein provided for by the said City of Jacksonville, for the said purpose, and the bonds mentioned, provided for and described in section 3 of this ordinance shall not be issued until the same are authorized by a majority of the qualified bond voters within and of the said City of Jacksonville, and the City Recorder of said City of Jacksonville, is hereby directed, authorized and ordered to publish a notice in The Jacksonville Post for a period of not less than fifteen days prior to the date for holding the said special election, and it is hereby ordered that the said notice shall contain a statement of the object of the proposed issue of bonds, and the estimated cost of the proposed system of water works, and a full copy of this ordinance.

SECTION V.

The City of Jacksonville, Oregon, has no system of water works or any supply of water for protection against fire and has no water to supply either to the City of Jacksonville, or to the citizens and inhabitants thereof suitable for drinking or domestic purposes and has no supply of water whatsoever for any of said purposes. That the property belonging to the City of Jacksonville and to the inhabitants and citizens thereof is in constant peril from fire; and the health of the citizens of said city is in constant danger from the impure water which they are required to use, and from the un-sanitary conditions which the present lack of water system entail upon the people of the city. That the health and safety of the City of Jacksonville demand the immediate passage and approval of this ordinance.

SECTION VI.

Whereas the public health and safety of the city, citizens and inhabitants of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, are imperiled by the lack of water system, and whereas the public health and safety are imperiled by any delay in the immediate passage, approval and immediate effect of this ordinance, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes of this Council and its approval by the Mayor.

SECTION VII.

Ordinance No. 125 is hereby repealed.
