of such lands to build said sidewalks. in the same way.

Sections 128, 129, 130, and 131, prescribe what shall be included in said order and notice, and the manner ANOTHER of serving the same and require that proof of service be made in the manner specified.

The two succeeding sections we give in full:

"Section 132. Hon. Hiero Kennedy Hanna, one of the best known and most highly respected citizens of Jackson county, passed away at his home in this city at 3 o'clock Monday, afteanoon.
