High School f und.

Every school district which at present maintains a high school will be benefitted, because it places behind every high school in the county, all the vast undeveloped resources of the county, and relieves the heavy burden of special tax, under which they are at present maintained.

Every small town which is maintaining grades above the eighth or struggling to establish a high school will be benefitted. An average daily attendance of ten pupils in the high school, means \$400.00 per year for the school. A high school of 20 pupils and one teacher is self supporting.

Any number of districts in thickly settled rural sections may unite for high school purposes and draw upon this fund.

Every high school in the county will be free to every pupil in the county who holds an eighth grade diploma.

The law will be a great incentive for the establishment of high schools in our small towns and rural sections, and a general uplift to the educational system of the county.

The standard fixed by the State Board of Education enables the small school of two or three rooms to meet the requirements.
