The assessed valuation of Jackson county for the year 1909 was approximately \$28,000,000. On this valuation a tax of four tenths of a mill on the dollar would produce \$10,400., or \$1,562. more than the required amount. In other words, a person who pays taxes on \$1,000. worth of property would have been required to contribute forty cents to this fund had the law been in operation during the last school year. Under this law the attendance in the high schools would be materially increased for every high school in the county would be free to every pupil in the county, but the assessed valuation is also increasing from year to year, so that the rate would probably remain about the same.
