

THE LAST STAND

Of the gamblers has been given up in Nevada

Nevada is a closed territory to the gambler. At least the law so declares it to be; and as a starter, at all events, the law is enforced. Press reports say that the gaming joints in the Nevada cities were closed in accordance with the requirements of the new law; and other paraphernalia by which those who would woo Dame Fortune were fleeced have been laid away to gather dust in a new and respectable sense. In all this we have evidence of regeneration in Nevada which the rest of the country is bound to regard with surprise. It is the capture of the border-land by the moral respectability of American civilization; for Nevada in all essentials has not developed beyond the dignity of a border state. It was the only commonwealth open to the big fight promoters; and on the occasion of the Reno mill a visitor would not have dreamed from appearances that gambling in any form would be abolished within the Nevada state borders for at least a thousand years to come.

It is not hoped or expected by reasonable people anywhere that the enforcement of the law in Nevada will prevent all men from gambling. The enforcement of similar law does not do that anywhere, no more than the enforcement of law against any other crime prevents the commission of that crime. But the people of Nevada came up to the standard of American decency when they made gambling a crime and enacted law for the punishment of those who commit it.

Gambling as a vice has lent literary picturesqueness to the West; but that was during the time when the border community of the West was more or less isolated from the rest of the world. As a literary ornament we might not wish that it had never been; but as a fact serving any but a vicious purpose, at the present time, we have no use for it. Gambling conducted openly and recognized as a legitimate business is no longer tolerated by the American people by which we mean gambling of the common type in which the common people indulge. In effect it is and always has been a crime against society, because it begets idleness and the worst forms of dissipation and brings about financial ruin.
