**THE SALOON IS DOOMED**

**The People Will Rule.**

The brewers, distillers and saloons have so trampled under foot the will of the people of Jackson county in forcing themselves upon our people who by a majority of 257 votes two years ago said, "We do not want the saloon," that this year all who believe in the rule of the people will vote out the saloons. The great brewing and distilling interests backing the saloons under the name of Greater Oregon Home Ruin Association are sending their hired servants at big salaries into our state to tell our people that prohibition doesn't prohibit.

They would not go to the expense of fighting prohibition if it did not prohibit.

The only ones that say prohibition will not prohibit when enacted by the people are the criminals. It is an insult to American patriotism to say that the will of the people will not be obeyed. A democracy crumbles to ruin when the will of the sovereign power expressed by a majority is not the law of the land honored and respected. Only a criminal will break the law. Only a criminal at heart will threaten to break the law.

The Oregonian, that friend of the saloon, said October 6th in an editorial under prohibition and liquor evils:

"The evil of liquor traffic—or rather of liquor drinking—are self-evident and no right-thinking person denies them. If it is the duty of the state to guard its citizens from liquor, that duty it can most effectually carry out by dunning into their ears from tender youth: 'Shun liquor; it maims and debauches and corrupts; avoid this danger as you would any that would destroy you.'

"Man or woman or child who fully knows the devil will not receive him as guest. The average person who understands the liquor poison will seldom take it into his stomach as beverage."

The evil of the liquor traffic could not be more fully confessed. If it is to be likened to the devil, and if the devil should not be received as a guest is it not the wise thing to put him out, when found within and to let him know that he must stay out?

Here is a letter written March 20th, 1910, to Gov. W. R. Stubbs of Kansas by the Judge of the 32nd Judicial District of Kansas. What is said in this letter is reliable, and contradicts the assertions of men who have sold out to the whiskey power:

"Garden City, Kan., March 20, 1910, 'Hon. W. R. Stubbs, Topeka, Kan.

My Dear Governor: In answer to your inquiry of the 19th inst., just received, it is a pleasure to say that convictions are less difficult in my district for violations of the prohibitory law than for the violation of any other criminal laws of the state. By a rigid enforcement of the law for many years, the former prejudice of the people against the law has completely changed to an extreme bias in its favor. When a jury is now impeached to try one charged with the violation of this law, instead of a juror disqualifying, as he formerly did, because of his prejudice against the law, he now often disqualifies on account of his frank admission of the extreme bias in its favor; and frequently care has been taken on the part of the court in protecting the rights of a defendant to prevent a conviction without sufficient evidence to sustain it. A man could no more start a joint in Garden City, or any other southwestern Kansas town, than he could willfully touch a torch to one of our best buildings. No good citizen would stand for it, no matter what his views on the liquor question.

"The result is, instead of being what was formerly considered the most lawless section of the state, we have become the most law-abiding people on the face of the earth. This judicial district, consisting of the nine southwestern counties, embraces a territory equal in size to the entire state of Connecticut with little old Rhode Island thrown in, yet in most of the counties there has not been a criminal case on the docket for over 15 years, and in some of the counties there has not been a civil difficulty of sufficient importance to justify the calling of a jury for the same length of time. One or two days is sufficient

time to transact the entire court business of a regular term in each of the five southwestern counties. The old argument that no one will settle in a prohibition community, is answered by the fact that our population has more than doubled in the last four years, and instead of property decreasing in value, it has enhanced in value from 100 to 1,000 per cent. I know of no one in the poorhouse, or in jail, in these nine counties; and our people are as healthy, happy and prosperous as can be found anywhere in the world, and may rightfully challenge comparison with any other similar territory with joints or saloons. If there are any other facts in my possession which you desire, will be glad to furnish them.
