

JUGGLING WITH FACTS

Figures do not lie but liars do figures.

A lie that is all a lie can be met and fought with outright. But a lie that is half the truth is a harder matter to fight.

To take facts and juggle them around, lists of figures and make them prove almost anything is easy for a clever man who isn't particular about the truth so we present to the thoughtful, intelligent voter a few FACTS easily verified.

FACT NO. 1 THE HOME RULE BILL IS THE REDDY BILL. Proof? Read the two bills as officially stated by the secretary of state in official pamphlets containing all initiative and referendum measures to be voted on and sent to every registered voter. On page 58 of pamphlet for 1908 the text of the Reddy bill is given as follows:-

PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

For constitutional amendment, giving additional and exclusive right to cities and towns within their corporate limits, to license, regulate, control and tax or to suppress or prohibit theatres, race-tracks, pool-rooms, bowling-alley, billiard halls, and the sale of liquors, subject to the provisions of the local option law of the state of Oregon. Compare this with the official wording of the "Home Rule" bill on page 73 of this year's official pamphlet:-

PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

For constitutional amendment giving to cities and towns exclusive power to license regulate, control suppress, or prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors within the municipality.

Verify these facts by reading the two bills in the official pamphlets. Notice only real difference is the original Reddy bill tries to hide its real purpose by dragging in theatres, pool-rooms, race-tracks etc. and a reference to the local option law, but the revised Reddy bill (Home Rule) states its purpose plainly and in the fewest possible words.

Note further that both bills are a proposed amendment to Section 2 of Article 11 of the constitution of Oregon. The saloon bunch (Greater Oregon Home Rule Association) declare through their hired speakers, posters, literature and the public press there is no connection between the offensive Reddy bill and the Home Rule bill; read both and exercise your common sense. They have tried to deceive you in this how about their other statements?

WE NOW HAVE HOME RULE IN OUR TOWNS AND CITIES

Section 2, Article 11 of the constitution of Oregon reads in part as follows:-

The Legislative Assembly shall NOT enact, amend or repeal any charter or act of incorporation for any municipality, city or town. The LEGAL VOTERS OF EVERY CITY AND TOWN ARE HEREBY GRANTED POWER TO ENACT AND AMEND THEIR MUNICIPAL CHARTER subject to the constitution and criminal laws of the state of Oregon. Isn't that Home Rule? What's the point of the Reddy bill? Simply to exempt all cities and towns from the provisions of the constitution and criminal laws of Oregon on the liquor question.

A incorporated town would be an independent sovereignty within the state and could enact laws contrary to the constitution of Oregon. What an absurdity, how foolish! What are they trying to twist this on an intelligent electorate for? Simply to entrench the saloon and give them special privileges. Will the saloon bunch fool you?

THE SALOON AND THE HOME.

The saloon bunch have placed on bill boards flaring posters stating that if the prohibition law passes your homes will be entered at midnight and searched for liquor. You probably laughed at the absurdity of that statement but here are the facts. 1-The provisions for the enforcement of the prohibition law are exactly the same as the present local option law now on our statute books. Compare Prohibition law Page 122, section 4 official initiative pamphlet of 1910 with section 17 local option law.

2-This law is in force in 21 counties in OREGON now; can the saloon men cite one incident in which the home of any man has been invaded in executing this law. Just one incident in our 21 counties.

Abuse of the Initiative.

It is a gross abuse of the rights guaranteed by the Initiative Referendum Amendment to the Oregon Constitution to bring up woman suffrage at every general election. This measure was submitted in 1900 and beaten by a plurality of 2137. In 1906 it was again proposed and was beaten by 10173. In 1908 it was again on the ballot and was beaten by a majority of 21649. Notwithstanding these repeated defeats, more decisive at each election, the same measure is again on the ballot this year.
